A BIT ABOUT US

About 15 years ago some members of the Tauranga Photographic Society decided to start an AV Group with the idea of learning about and sharing audio-visuals. The group met on a Sunday morning at different member's homes, often ending with food and a cup of tea or coffee - certainly enough for lunch! Gradually the group got too big and the meetings were shifted to the Arts and Craft Centre on a Monday evening.



We soon realised that for many members of PSNZ, the only AV competition was the Jack Sprosen Memorial Trophy Salon, held once a year. We decided to set up a second competition in June to support the JSMT and so that there was another opportunity to share AVs. In those early years our aim was to encourage members to have a go so we did not allow entries of AVs that had already won an award in the JSMT. We also adopted the maximum AV time and many other rules of the JSMT. It is only now that those close ties are being broken.

One thing which makes this salon different from others is the judging system. It is based on a system used by NZIPP - NewZealand Institute of Professional Photographers. By using 5-6 judges we are able to allow judges to enter two categories without having conflict of interest issues.

About this time, Alistair and I joined the Australian Photographic Society. One year we attended an AV weekend workshop in Mildura. By attending that weekend and the APS Conventions we got to know many of the AV workers. Eventually this led to the Australian AV workers being invited to enter the Tauranga AV Salon. Jeff Morris from South Africa attended one of those APS Conventions and asked if South Africa could enter as well. Gradually AV workers from different countries asked if they could enter and over the next few years the salon became increasingly international. This year there were entries from nine different countries.



As the original members have been getting older it has been difficult to encourage new members to become involved. This is one of the reasons for the decision to make this year our last one. Now that we no longer have to spend time organising the salon, we plan to spend that time creating audio-visuals to enter into other salons.






The heritage listed Palm House in the Adelaide Botanic Gardens inspired the author to make a model.


